Irish Sailing Developments

- Assistant Instructor Qualification
 - Assistant Instructor qualification now issued by Training Centre on Passport
 - Clarification of pre-requisites and role depending on age, 15 – 17ys or 17yrs+, published
- Passport Sailor Log
 - All personal skills certification now issued via Checklick online Passport
 - Sailors to be encouraged to use Passport to log personal sailing both on training courses and any other sailing activity
 - Instructor Pre-Entry and Assistant Instructor also recorded on Passport

Irish Sailing Developments

- Revised Powerboat Scheme
 - Launched June 1st
 - Syllabus details in Instructor Handbook

Key Points

- Increased use of Introduction To Powerboating
- More consistent delivery and standard of certification on National Powerboat Certificate
- New module on Safetyboat Certificate course catering for non-sailing specific use
- New Intermediate Powerboat Certificate replacing Recreational Powerboat Certificate

- Lead Instructor
 - Mentor
 - Organiser

Senior Instructor Role

- Communicator
 - Sailors
 - Instructor team
 - Parents
 - Committee
 - Management
 - Irish Sailing
- Developer
 - Courses
 - Activities
 - Instructors
 - Other helpers



- Age *
 - Must be 17 within 6 months of course start date
- National Powerboat Certificate*
 - Tiller and console endorsed
 - 20 hours logged after course
- Pass the Pre-Entry Assessment*
- Current First Aid Certificate
 - Course min 8 hrs
 - Covering CPR and Cold water immersion
- Safeguarding 1(from 1/9/2017)
- Garda Vetting, Irish Sailing



^{*} Items must be completed before commencing the instructor course. Other items may be completed within 6 months following the course but certification process is quicker if all completed in advance

- Advanced Instructor (additional pre-requisites)
 - Safetyboat certificate
 - Logged instructional experience
 - Logged personal skills experience, Note: Club instructors typically lack adventure skills type experience, commercial centre instructors typically lack racing experience
- Senior Instructor (additional pre-requisites)
 - Age 19yrs
 - Safetyboat certificate
 - Logged instructional experience in at least 2 organisations
 - Hold Adv instructor endorsement or complete pre entry assessment



Common Issues

- Pre-entry
 - Lack of double handed experience
 - Lack of practice of Seamanship type skills
 - Lack of pre-preparation for background paper
- Powerboat Certification
 - Certification in console only boats
 - Insufficient logged experience
 - Lack of exposure to suitable boats
- Emergency Care / First Aid
 - Uncertainty over providers meeting requirements
 - Accessing providers



Possible Solutions

- Pre-entry
 - Run during sailing season (July / Aug), valid for 12mths
 - Provide focused coaching in suitable boats, ADV or ABH instructor most suitably qualified to deliver
 - SI to run a mock assessment
 - Contact local Instructor Trainer for guidance
 - Consider running over 2 days to allow for coaching time with Trainer
 - Smaller organisations pool with others near by to share pre-req elements
 - Register with Irish Sailing to publicise and improve ease of access for participants



Possible Solutions

- Powerboat Certification
 - Start with Intro To Powerboat cert in suitable boats at a younger age, as part of AI / Instructor prep
 - Ensure PB courses offer both tiller and console boats
 - Incentivise experience building through engagement with other club activity
 - Look at providing at cost / subsidised PB training in your organisation
 - Smaller organisations pool with others near by to share pre-req elements
 - Consider upgrade to Safetyboat cert as part of CPD / Incentive package



Suggestions from training workshops

- Continue sailing skills development as long as possible before rushing into instructor pathway
- Involve advanced module participants in course management
- Use an intern year with mix of assisting and pre-requisite prep
- Schedule in pre-req courses in advance between neighbour clubs
- Share resources between neighbour clubs and schools, e.g. boat types, PB only school work with club
- Use resources in your organisation, e.g. PB instructors,
 Emergency care instructors



Instructor Development

Typical Pathway

- Assistant Instructor
 - Min age 15
 - Hold at least 1 advanced module cert
 - Trained in house by SI
 - Experience building / role familiarisation
 - Start acquiring instructor pre-requisites
- Dinghy Instructor
 - Begin with Start Sailing or Basic Skills
 - Develop into Improving Skills
 - Diversify experience with different age groups and / or locations (work towards Adv instructor or SI)



Instructor Development

Typical Pathway

Advanced Instructor

- Wide range of instructional experience
- High level of personal skill in a range of boats
- Good range and depth of background knowledge
- Dynamic / energetic personality
- Sport role model

Senior Instructor

- Wide range of instructional experience in a number of locations
- Solid core skills and background knowledge
- Very good organisational skills
- Ability to communicate effectively with all groups
- Good leadership qualities
- Mentor to others



Instructor Course Organisation

- Who can host instructor courses?
 - Any Irish Sailing Training Centre can host instructor courses or CPDs for disciplines and levels for which it has accreditation
 - There are requirements for equipment, shore and water facilities which need to be available for the course (available online or contact your local Instructor Trainer)



Instructor Course Organisation

- When to run them?
 - For DI courses peak demand is Oct mid-term and Easter
 - For ADV and SI courses participants are generally college age so work around exam times
 - Late Aug is under used and a good time for DI before back to school
 - Beginning Sep could be good for college students
 - Courses can also be split over two weekends



Instructor Course Organisation

- Setting up a course
 - 1. Contact an Instructor Trainer to check requirements, dates and moderating Trainer (Contact details online)
 - 2. Email training@sailing.ie with the above information min of 1 month ahead of the course
 - 3. Ensure those booking on to the course have the required pre-requisites
 - 4. Work with course Trainer to circulate pre-course information to participants
 - 5. Confirm numbers with IS Training for course packs
