Rule 30.1 (Round-an-End) applies. Flag I was displayed.

- 1. 53 seconds before the start, you observe a boat on the course side of the line near the RC boat.
- 2. She then sails down through the line and reappears beyond the pin end on the course side of the line.
- 3. She sails back to the pre-start side of the line and starts with the rest of the fleet in a very good position.


What would you do?

After the start signal
In scoring her



Has this boat complied with 30.1?







Rule 30.1 (Round-an-End Rule) applies.

<u>Answer</u> = Yes.

Rule 30.1 requires that the boat cross an **extension** of the starting line from the course side to the start side before she starts, and she meets this requirement.



Situation 2

The SIs state a time limit for boats to finish 'after the first boat sails the course and finishes'.

The race was started with a Black Flag signal.

Boat A was OCS before and at the start.

Boat B was in the triangle within the last minute, but was entirely on the pre-start side of the line at the start.

Boat A finished in 1st place and B finished 2nd.



Will the finishing time of either A or B trigger the start of the time limit for boats finishing 'after the first boat sails the course and finishes'?

Boat B will trigger the start of the time limit as she has complied with the definition Start and with rule 28.1.

Should the RC make a sound signal for either A or B?
