Objective	The aim of the ISA Day Skipper (Motor) course is to provide participants with the basic skills and knowledge necessary to skipper a motor yacht by day in waters with which you are familiar.
	day iii waters with which you are familiar.
Previous knowledge / experience	For the Day Skipper (Motor) it will be assumed that you will have mastered the skills and knowledge covered in The ISA Helmsmans course.
Types of Boats	The course must be completed aboard a motor yacht which may be either displacement, semi displacement or planning and have either twin or single inboard
Duration	5 days during which you will be living on board the training boat.
Assessment	Assessment is continuous through the course. However Instructors may at their discretion require the use of a formal practical assessment of boat handling skills and or a short written paper or oral interview in assessing your level of background knowledge.
	Day Skipper certificates may only be awarded following successful course completion. Certificates cannot therefore be issued solely on the basis of assessments completed without course attendance.
	By the end of this course you will be able to do the following:
Preparation for sea	⇒ Engine, battery and fuel checks
	⇒ Stopcocks and stowage
	⇒ Personal and yacht's safety equipment checks
	⇒ Sea area forecasts: sources and local interpretation
	⇒ Discussion of 5 day overall plan and crew briefing
	⇒ Chart and publications check
	⇒ Basic tidal considerations

Safety	⇒ Precautions necessary to prevent fire, use of fire blanket and extinguishers, use of personal safety equipment, precautions necessary when using gas appliances
	⇒ Care necessary when cooking in a seaway
	⇒ Understanding of how, and when, to use all safety equipment
Deck work	⇒ Slipping a buoy and unberthing
	⇒ Mooring to a buoy
	⇒ Berthing alongside marina pontoon and harbour wall
	⇒ Preparing to anchor, anchoring and weighing anchor
	⇒ Use of warps and springs
	⇒ Setting up to give or take a tow
Navigation	⇒ Understanding of charted information, distances and direction
	⇒ Basic visual position fixing
	⇒ Position fixing by GPS or similar radio navigation aid
	⇒ Simple course to steer for short passages
	⇒ IALA A Buoyage
	⇒ Yacht's log book as navigational record
	⇒ Use of sailing directions, cruising guides and cruising almanacs
General duties	Day to day running of a cruising yacht, allocating watch rotas, housekeeping duties and provisioning

Basic pilotage techniques	⇒ Prepare simple pilotage plan
	⇒ Use of transits, clearing bearings and soundings
	⇒ Use of electronic navigation aids such as radar and GPS or Loran
Handling and manoeuvring	⇒ Bring the motor cruiser safely to and from a berth alongside a pontoon and harbour wall
	⇒ Manoeuvre in restricted space using springs, turning in confined space
	⇒ Bring the motor cruiser safely to and from a buoy
	⇒ Anchor and weigh anchor under tidal conditions
	⇒ Ability to take control and effect rescue of man overboard
	⇒ Hold a steady compass course at night
Rules of the road	⇒ Importance of keeping a good lookout at all times
	⇒ Working knowledge of International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea
Weather	⇒ Awareness of the sources of local sea forecasts
	⇒ Interpretation of sea area forecasts
	⇒ Importance of barometer in local forecasting
