Objective	The aim of the ISA Yachtmaster Coastal (Sail) course is to provide participants with the basic skills and knowledge necessary to skipper a sailing yacht by night and day in waters with which they are not familiar
Previous knowledge / experience	For the Yachtmaster Coastal Sea-based Course attendance Cert. (Sail) it will be assumed that you will have mastered the skills and knowledge covered in The ISA
Types of Boats	The course must be completed aboard a sailing yacht.
Duration	5 days during which you will be living on board the training boat.
Assessment	Assessment is continuous through the course. However Instructors may at their discretion require the use of a formal practical assessment of boat handling skills and or a short written paper or oral interview in assessing your level of background knowledge. The ISA Yachtmaster Coastal (Sail) Sea-based Course Attendance Certificate may only be awarded following successful course completion. Certificates cannot therefore be issued solely on the basis of assessments completed without course at-

	⇒ Chart and publications check

	Safety briefing
	Watch keeping schedules
	Secure stowage
	Allocation of responsibilities
Pilotage	Preparation of effective pilotage plan
	Use of transits, buoys, lights, clearing and danger bearings and soundings
	Use of GPS, radar
	Preparation of tidal height and stream information
	Port or harbour regulations
Passage making and responsibility as skipper	Organisation and running of navigation and domestic duties of a cruising yacht on passage
	Crew welfare and management
	Radio communications
	Effective use of yacht's radio navigation aids and instrumentation
	Awareness of changes in weather conditions
Yacht handling under power	Turning in confined spaces
	All berthing and unberthing situations with any combination of wind and tide

Yacht handling under sail	Sail efficiently on all points of sailing Effective sail control and trim Anchoring and mooring with any combination of wind and tide Control under sail in confined waters
Adverse weather conditions	Preparation for heavy weather Yacht handling in strong winds Conduct in restricted visibility
Rules of the road	Full working knowledge of International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea
Emergency situations	Can take correct action as helmsman for recovery of man overboard Full understanding of correct use of flares, liferaft, radio, EPIRB Understanding of action required when abandoning to liferaft and during helicopter and lifeboat rescue
